

Minutes of MICK REUNION - August 2, 1986

The Mick Reunion was held at Micksburg with about 70 persons present, coming from New Hampshire, U.S.A., New Jersey, U.S.A., Missouri, U.S.A., British Columbia, Moorefield, Toronto, Chatham, Gravenhurst, Powassan, New Liskeard, London, Richmond, Almonte, Arnprior, Haley Station, North Bay, Rankin, Carleton Place, Beachburg, Pembroke, and Micksburg.
